Two Breads – John 6:22-40

This week, as we wrestle with the news of the Presidential election, we can't help but see two reactions to the results. Some are absolutely horrified at what they think Trump will do over the next 4 years, while others are absolutely ecstatic believing Trump will 'make America great again.' And sadly, there are not too many people who stand in between these two extremes. In our passage this morning we see the same type of fickleness from the crowd as they chase Jesus, many of them wanting to make Jesus their king. But Jesus' humble response to the crowd is not to tell them what they want to hear, nor to give them what they want, but rather to teach them the truth about their own motives. Jesus tells the crowd to look for something far greater than a temporal leader, and far more beneficial than temporary signs. Jesus calls them to search and work for eternal things that can only be found in the one who grants eternal life. Only Jesus can bring eternal life and hope. "The work of God is this: to believe in the one he has sent" John 6:29.
