Judgement on Judah - Isaiah 3:1-4:1

No one likes to be told they are wrong. In fact, we often say to others, "Don't judge me!" But in the Book of Common Prayer (the Anglican guide to running church) we read these words in the communion service, "Therefore judge yourselves, brothers and sisters, that you might not be judged by the Lord; repent truly of your sins..."

The judgement pronounced by God on Judah in Isaiah 3 comes because the people of Judah neglected to recognise the damage their actions were causing others. They did not carefully assess their own lives in the light of God's word. And so as we read about this sad moment in Judah's history we are gently warned to not fall in the same trap. Our own judgement must come one way or the other.
