If you are new, visiting, or one of our regulars we are glad you have joined us today.



As we enter Chapter 3 of Titus, we notice a familiar pattern to the apostle Paul's teaching. He describes the behaviour expected of the Cretan Christians, and then he explains the underlying belief behind this expected behaviour. Verses 1 and 2 begin, "...be subject to rulers and authorities, ... be obedient, ...be ready to do whatever is good...", all commands. And verses 3-7, "At one time we too were ... disobedient... We lived in malice and envy, being hated and hating one another. But when the kindness and love of God our Saviour appeared, he saved us..." He concludes in verse 8, "...those who have trusted in God may be careful to devote themselves to doing what is good." As we grow in our understanding of the gospel, may this translate into devoting ourselves to doing what is good.

KAIROS PRISON MINISTRY

Kairos is a movement born within evangelical churches to take the love of Jesus into those in prison. Teams of Christians from many churches are gathered and train together for a

number of weeks before they are sent into a correctional centre for what is called a short course(5 days). This team gives talks, prays, sings and has fun encouraging the residents to feel the love of Jesus in action. Usually residents experience Jesus love through the bonded team and in the knowledge that folk worldwide are praying for them. They receive gifts such as copious numbers of biscuits and slices and letters of encouragement. After the week they are able to meet together to talk about their experience and to keep a check on their lives as far as prayer, study and action are concerned. Zoom meetings can occur with team members.

Kairos is a great outreach and offers much as you give yourself to his service. If you are interested in finding out more see Pam Stone who is a chaplain for Kairos 4 at Kempsey in September.
