I have never been a great student of literature. In fact, I think I was one of only two people in my High School English class who actually spoke English at home! And so I have never really appreciated until recently the craftsmanship and effort that goes into writing, especially things like songs or poetry. It has only as I have taken the time to look in depth at the Psalms that I have begun to appreciate the beauty of words.

There is beauty in the way words express the emotions of a writer. And there is beauty in the way words can paint a crystal clear picture of what is happening in an author's life.

But the Book of Psalms is one step better than that. God is the ultimate author of the Psalms; The LORD is the one inspiring these words. The Book of Psalms is about relationships with Him. It's about His character, and it's about the struggles of His people.

As we take a break from our regular preaching series this January, we have the opportunity to continue to discover more of the character of God, and some of the struggles of His people as we enjoy the Psalms of Summer.

Psalms 20-23, attributed to King David, open up for us some of the most significant times of our lives. Through the joy of great victories, the difficulties of seemingly unanswered prayer, the challenge of facing death, and the comfort of a God who walks with and strengthens His people.

I encourage you to come prepared each Sunday as we explore together the Psalms of this Summer. Read and reread Psalms 20-23, and meditate on what is going on in each of these very special Psalms. I am sure you will notice some of the connections to the New Testament, but remember God has always be seeking to strengthen His people even before Jesus was born more than 2000 years ago.

So, as we meditate on these Psalms together, come and identify with the ongoing struggles of God's people in these Psalms, but also discover the heart of our eternal God, and the comfort that He brings. And as you meditate on these Psalms this Summer, may you be equipped to face the challenges that life throws at us, and may we be able to help those around us who seem to struggle no end. May we offer the comfort of King Jesus as he prepares us for eternity with Him.
